**DECEMBER 15, 2021 FINAL ORDER**  
**CLOSING SKILL-BASED AMUSEMENT MACHINE LICENSE APPLICATION**

On August 21, 2018, J&J Leasing, LLC (“Registered Applicant”) filed a Skill-Based Amusement Machine Type-C Operator Application (“Application”) with the Ohio Casino Control Commission (“Commission”). The Registered Applicant failed to cooperate with the Commission throughout the course of its investigation by not providing necessary information, even after being notified to do so. As a result, the Commission issued a Notice of Opportunity for Hearing (“Notice”) to the Registered Applicant.

Upon proper service of the Notice and pursuant to R.C. 119.07 and 3772.04, the Registered Applicant had a right to a hearing if requested within 30 days of the Notice’s mailing. The Registered Applicant failed to do so, and no hearing was held. The matter was brought before the Commission on December 15, 2021, for final adjudication. R.C. 119.07 and 3772.04(A).

**WHEREFORE**, the Commission **FINDS** and **CONCLUDES** as follows:

The Registered Applicant failed to cooperate with the Commission throughout the course of its investigation, as set forth in the Notice.

**WHEREFORE**, the Commission **ORDERS** as follows:

- 1) The previously filed Application is **CLOSED** for failure to comply with the law.
- 2) This Order constitutes a **FINAL DETERMINATION** for purposes of Ohio Adm.Code 3772-50-09(C), thereby rendering the Applicant’s associated Skill-Based Amusement Machine Registration ineffective.
- 3) This Order **PROHIBITS** the Applicant from starting or continuing to operate in any capacity or manner that requires a license under Ohio Adm.Code Chapter 3772-50.
- 4) A certified copy of the Order will be served upon the Applicant, via certified mail, return receipt requested, and his counsel of record, if any, via ordinary mail.

**IT IS SO ORDERED.**

**NOTICE OF APPEAL RIGHTS**

The Party is hereby notified that pursuant to R.C. 119.12, the Commission Order may be appealed by filing a Notice of Appeal with the Commission setting forth the Order that the Party is appealing from and stating that the Commission's Order is not supported by reliable, probative, and substantial evidence and is not in accordance with law. The Notice of Appeal may also include, but is not required to include, the specific grounds for the appeal. The Notice of Appeal must also be filed with the Franklin County Court of Common Pleas in accordance with R.C. 119.12. In filing the Notice of Appeal with the Commission or Court, the filing may be either the original Notice of Appeal or a copy thereof. The Notice of Appeal must be filed within 15 days after the date of mailing of the Commission Order.
