**AUGUST 18, 2021 FINAL ORDER**  
**DENYING CASINO GAMING EMPLOYEE LICENSE APPLICATION**

On November 2, 2020, Angela Reyes filed a Casino Gaming Employee License Application (“Application”) with the Ohio Casino Control Commission (“Commission”). Thereafter, the Commission conducted a suitability investigation to determine Reyes’s eligibility for such a license.

During the investigation, the Commission discovered sufficient derogatory information to warrant issuance of a Notice of Opportunity for Hearing (“Notice”). Upon proper service of the Notice, Reyes had the right to a hearing if timely requested. Reyes initially requested a hearing, but later withdrew that request. Ultimately, no hearing was held. The matter is now before the Commission for final adjudication.

**WHEREFORE**, the Commission **FINDS** and **CONCLUDES** as follows:

Reyes failed to establish suitability for licensure by clear and convincing evidence, as required by R.C. 3772.10 or Ohio Adm.Code 3772-8-05, for the reasons set forth in the Notice.

**WHEREFORE**, the Commission **ORDERS** as follows:

- 1) Reyes’s Application is **DENIED**.
- 2) Reyes is **PROHIBITED** from working or otherwise serving in any capacity that requires a license under R.C. Chapter 3772.
- 3) Reyes is **PROHIBITED** from reapplying for licensure under R.C. Chapter 3772 for three years from entry of this Order, absent a waiver granted by the Commission commensurate with Ohio Adm.Code 3772-1-04.
- 4) A certified copy of the Order shall be served upon Reyes, via certified mail, return receipt requested, and any counsel of record via ordinary mail.

**NOTICE OF APPEAL RIGHTS**

The Party is hereby notified that pursuant to R.C. 119.12, the Commission Order may be appealed by filing a Notice of Appeal with the Commission setting forth the Order that the Party is appealing from and stating that the Commission's Order is not supported by reliable, probative, and substantial evidence and is not in accordance with law. The Notice of Appeal may also include, but is not required to include, the specific grounds for the appeal. The Notice of Appeal must also be filed with the Franklin County Court of Common Pleas in accordance with R.C. 119.12. In filing the Notice of Appeal with the Commission or Court, the filing may be either the original Notice of Appeal or a copy thereof. The Notice of Appeal must be filed within 15 days after the date of mailing of the Commission Order.
